C. B. Community Schools

Renewed general support for a trauma-informed independent high school that serves the most at-risk, traumatized students who are currently or were previously in foster care in Philadelphia.

Renewed support to the Center for Court Innovation for their Midtown Community Court - Rapid Engagement Program (REP).
