Prisons & Jails

MARCH 2016

Esperanza

To support an in-house, part-time psychiatrist for home visits to young people, aged 11-18, who are involved in the juvenile justice system (\$100,000 over two years).

New York Foundling

For the Families Rising Program, an alternative to incarceration effort for youthful offenders which brings Functional Family Therapy into the offender's home and family and treats PTSD and other mental illnesses (\$75,000 over two years).

Osborne Association

For a mental health professional trained in trauma therapy to treat ex-offenders in the agency's community settings (\$100,000 over two years).

JUNE 2016

Witness to Innocence

For a social worker to connect exonerated death row survivors to mental health services and benefits (\$50,000 over two years).

NOVEMBER 2016

BronxConnect (FORMERLY URBAN YOUTH ALLIANCE INTERNATIONAL)

For support of "Sound Minds Sound Futures" initiative to increase high-risk youth receiving counseling, enhance onsite clinical staff capacity, and train staff on the Seven Challenges model (\$150,000 over two years).

Fortune Society

For additional clinical supervisory capacity to address deeper mental health barriers affecting the most at-risk incarcerated people transitioning back into society (\$150,000 over two years).

Prisoners' Legal Services of New York

For the "Mental Health Project" launch including a supervised staff attorney to advocate on behalf of youth under 21 years of age and veterans who suffer from mental illness in New York State prisons (\$150,000 over two years).

APRIL 2017

College and Community Fellowship

For support of a Trauma-Informed Awareness (TIA) initiative, the organization's first ongoing mental-health related program component for formerly incarcerated women (\$50,000 over two years).

Getting Out and Staying Out

To hire an eighth Career Manager, a Licensed Master of Social Work (LMSW) professional who will help reduce caseloads and improve clients' mental health supports (\$100,000 over two years).

HopeWorx

To support the "Community Advocates" program, which trains people with lived experience of mental illness and incarceration to mentor others who are newly released, or serving time in county jail (\$50,000 over two years).

Hour Children

To support the hiring of a Dyadic Developmental Psychotherapy trained therapist to coordinate the Mental Health Services Program and provide in-home treatment for kids aged 3-4 and their formerly incarcerated mothers (\$100,000 over two years).

Hudson Link for Higher Education in Prison

Support to make the Academic Coordinator position at Fishkill Correctional Facility full-time to increase enrollment, and to contribute to the pipeline of trained case managers, mental health counselors and social workers with direct experience of incarceration (\$85,000 over two years).

Innocence Project

For support of the Social Work program, which provides a range of services including mental health support to help wrongfully convicted clients prior to, during, and after their exoneration (\$25,000).

NOVEMBER 2017

Horticultural Society of New York

To support an "Aftercare Coordinator" who will provide critical mentoring services as former Rikers inmates re-enter their community and the job market (\$150,000 over two years).

Human Development Services of Westchester

To expand case management and reentry supports for women incarcerated at Westchester County Jail (\$50,000 over two years).
